February Birthstone

February's purple birthstone has been found among the possessions of royalty throughout the ages. The intense violet hue of Amethyst appealed to early monarchs. Purple dye was scarce and expensive at one time, and was reserved for the garments of kings and queens. Amethyst has been found in ruins dating as far back as

The ancient Greeks believed that this gemstone held many powers, among them protection against intoxication. In fact, the word Amethyst comes from the Greek word "amethystos," meaning sober. In ancient Greece, the gemstone was associated with the god of wine, and it was common practice to serve this beverage from Amethyst goblets in the belief that this would prevent overindulgence. Even today, Amethyst is considered a stabilizing force for those struggling to overcome addictive behaviors.

Once considered more valuable than diamonds, Amethyst is a member of the quartz family, occurring naturally as crystals within rocks. Deposits of this gemstone are found in Brazil, Canada, Australia, India, Madagascar, Namibia, Russia, Sri Lanka; and in the United States.

The gift of Amethyst is symbolic of protection and the power to overcome difficulty. It is said to strengthen the bond in a love relationship, so it is an ideal anniversary or engagement gem. Whether or not Amethyst holds such power, its stunning beauty will certainly make anyone who wears it feel like royalty!

1. Membership process

a. How to begin with the application and the \$?

Group discussion on how the process should work. Decision as follows: The application and money should first go to the Treasurer for recording dollars. Then the Treasurer will give the application to the Membership Coordinator for addition to the club roster.

b. Printing of cards for new members throughout the year?

Decision: The membership coordinator will print cards as they receive the applications. A suggestion for having blank cards available to hand out as soon as the application is received was agreed upon by those present. This will facilitate the cards getting to the members in a timely manner.

c. <u>Disbursement of the membership roster:</u> Kristen will have 35 copies available at the January meeting. This will be the roster that is submitted to the Federation. 3. Show Status

<u>a. Encourage more volunteers</u>: Marv submitted a nice write up for the show process in the January newsletter that will hopefully encourage our membership to participate.

b. Funds: Discussion on vendor fees and current bank balance.

<u>c. Electricity needs</u>: Discussion regarding need to update the current electrical wiring for the show. The invoice submitted and paid to LeRoy Bieler is missing. Marv shared that we can do the show one more year without up grading if we cannot locate the invoice. An inventory can be taken at the end of the show for an accurate need.

4. Club Budget Approval/Discussion

a. Review of proposed yearly club budget. This is deferred to the February meeting so that an accounting of the bills from the Artisan Fair and annual bills can be accounted for.

5. 503 C application/desire

a. Do we want to be a non-profit organization? Discussion by the group with a decision of yes. This will assist in protecting the elected officers and make our club eligible for nonprofit donations. Laura will investigate the process. Review of other clubs that are non-profit status with the state would be a good starting place for the process.

b. Pros: Non-profit donations, elected officer protection.

c. Cons: Remain a social club. Time it may take to complete the application.

6. New bank account options

- a. History with Sterling Savings: As an executive board, the ability of the bank to provide statements electronically has not happened after multiple attempts. The request for check images attached to the monthly statement has not been successful. The move from Sterling will only be for the checking account and not for the bond. The bond will remain at Sterling.
- b. Other <u>Banking options</u>: Pacific Crest Federal Credit Union has a good reputation of working with its members. Decision is to proceed with moving the checking account for the club to Pacific Crest.

7. Other

Charity Chair: The Longs are resigning their chair position and this will need to be addressed at the club meeting. In addition, funds are tight and the membership should vote on the monthly \$25 donations continuing. We thank them for their service in this capacity for the last two years. This will be brought up at the club meeting in January.

Historian: No volunteers at present. Jeff is continuing to digitize old photos to disk so that we can keep the history.

Librarian: There has been less interest in the library books at the present. However the black light is seeing good usage. Historically, the years vary on the usage. Discussion with the internet providing instant results may make the library less enticing. Suggestion was to add more content to the website for members to access.

Junior Program Leader: Laura remains the leader at present. Rachel Limb is the current youth leader and will be graduating in June. Group discussed starting to look for a successor for this role.

Newsletter editor: Group discussed the need for a dedicated newsletter editor that will be with the club for at least 2 years. The membership relies on the newsletter for information in a timely manner. Our newsletter reflects our membership and we want a good showing for ourselves and other clubs.

Field Trips: Our August field trip should not compete with the Federation trip on Aug 9-11 in Butte Montana. Members have indicated that they would like to attend the Federation meeting and a club field trip in August. At present, the club field trip is looking more like the 3rd weekend. More information to come.

NWF Website: The information for the Rock and Arrowhead club on the Federation site is old information. Kathi will send the current information to the Federation webmaster for updating.

Executive Board Meetings: Group discussion that Executive board meetings should be every other month except for March when we have our show. The meeting schedule will be the first Monday before the club meeting in January, February, April, June, August, October and December. This may be subject to change depending on board availability.


